Creating Young Readers

Encouraging kids to read regularly can help them build a lifelong love of learning and exploration. NPL is dedicated to providing a safe and encouraging space to create young readers inside the library and throughout our community. With this as our driving focus in 2022, we created new reading challenges for kids: 1,000 Books Before
Kindergarten, Expand Your Horizons: Junior, 100 Books Before High
School, and 100 Books Before Graduation. We provided more than 145 outreach programs to students, which included book talks, storytimes, and monthly book deliveries. 76 kids and teens entered the NPL Creative
Writing Contest and more than 500 kids and teens participated in the Summer Reading Challenge.


