


Sweet Reads:

Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet by Jamie Ford



The novel explores themes of prejudice, sacrifice, family, and enduring hope.

Sugar Birds by Cheryl Grey Bostrom



Love Requires Chocolate by Ravynn K. Stringfield



Sweet Nothings: Confessions of a Candy Lover by Sarah Perry



Sugar and Salt by Susan Wiggs



Honey Girl by Morgan Rogers



Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl


