The Midnight Library by Matt Haig (Contemporary + Speculative or Magical Realism)



The Night Circus by Erin Morgenstern (Fantasy + Romance)




The Seven Husbands of Evelyn Hugo by Taylor Jenkins Reid (Historical + Mystery/Thriller)


The Long Way to a Small, Angry Planet by Becky Chambers (Science Fiction + Romance & Fantasy)

Mexican Gothic by Silvia Moreno-Garcia (Horror + Mystery or Fantasy)



Practical Magic by Alice Hoffman (Mystery + Fantasy / Magical Realism)


